Re: 2015 Emergency Medical Services Grant Round

On behalf of the North Dakota Board of University and School Lands (Land Board), the Energy Infrastructure and Impact Office is accepting grant applications from eligible counties, cities, and ambulance districts for needs resulting from impacts from oil and gas development activities. The Legislature allocated \$6 million of the Energy Impact Funds to EMS for the 2015-2017 biennium.

Requests for funding to improve readiness, quality, and responsiveness of oil and gas development impacted EMS response teams will be considered. Applications may be for projects to improve coverage; response; equipment; facilities; safety; staffing; training; leadership development; and planning efforts to formalize regional mutual aid or joint powers agreements.

An advisory committee of local EMS officials will assist in reviewing the applications and will make recommendations to the Land Board, which will make grants. Criteria used in evaluating requests will include: safety improvement; financial need; result of energy activity; project readiness; and contribution to long term viability.

Please seek the assistance of a library, school or extension office if you do not have computer and Internet access to retrieve this information.

Grant applications must be postmarked June 17, 2015. Applications submitted by e-mail will be accepted until 11:59 p.m. Central Time on June 17, 2015. Award notification is expected for late June or early July 2015.**

Funds will not be disbursed to successful grant recipients until: projects or acquisitions are substantially complete and the supporting documentation is submitted along with a request for distribution of funds and as funds are available in the oil and gas impact grant fund, which collects a portion of oil production taxes each month.
